

PREPARATION FOR YEAR 13 LP2 EXAMS

Year 13 LP2 exams are planned for the week commencing 29th January 2024. Please see below a full timetable. It is important to consider your revision now and start planning for when you will complete it.

During tutorial you have spent some time considering how to use your time more productively through time-blocking. This important skill you will now use to put a revision planner in place.

Making a revision timetable that works

A solid study planner is the key to making sure you cover everything you need to in time for the exam. It also has the added benefit of breaking everything down into more manageable chunks – revision suddenly feels much less daunting.

Once you start getting everything out on paper or screen, you will have a proper idea of the task ahead. The ideal revision timetable will be prepared far enough in advance that you can keep a good study/life balance and do not burn yourself out.

Start your revision timetable using this very simple model:

- Work out how many revision days you have left until your exams.
- Decide how much time you will spend revising on each day.

then

- Make a list of all the exams you need to revise for.
- Share the available revision time around each subject and/or exam.

Once you have got the basic timetable in place, you can start breaking those subject timings down into topics. You might then tweak it to suit your own study style (for instance, focusing more on one specific subject and less on another). More on that below.

If you can access your timetable on the go (using something such as Google Docs or an app – see some app ideas below) you'll have more flexibility over where you can study.

Prioritising your revision

Spend some time working out which subjects and topics need more of your revision time. You can then focus on these in your study planner.

A few things to think about:

- Y13 LP1 results. These might have flagged areas you need to work on.
- Uni offers. You might need to work harder to achieve certain parts of your offer.
- Teacher feedback. Ask your teacher if they think there are certain areas where you need to focus.
- Course specification. You can download the specification for each of your subjects. It will list
 everything that you're expected to know, so you can then check your revision plan is
 covering all it needs to.

Do not forget to make time for your stronger subjects too.

Regular refreshers

If you possibly can, try to make time to revise topics more than once - especially the ones you find tricky. Ideally you will have a plan that covers all the topics and then has refresher sessions for each. In this way, your understanding of each topic will stay fresh.



Past Papers

There is really no way to exaggerate the usefulness of past papers. Looking back at exams from previous years will help you get in the zone. You can get used to how questions are worded and set yourself the challenge of taking them against the clock. Plug time into your revision timetable to go through past papers regularly.

Revision Timetable Apps

These three popular apps can help you structure and plan your revision schedule. They offer study timetable templates to start from, along with other features to help you stay focused.

- My Study Life: an app to use throughout the year, not just during your revision period. Track homework and assignments and organise your daily and weekly schedule. Everything is stored in the Cloud for easy access on multiple devices. Available on: Play Store, iTunes.
- SQA My Study Plan: created by the Scottish Qualification Authority for Scottish students, the
 app creates a personalised study plan based on when your exams are you can import your
 exam timetable directly from SQA MyExams. Available on: <u>Play Store</u>, <u>iTunes</u>.
- Timetable: if you're an Android-head, Timetable is one way to manage school life across your devices. The app even mutes your phone during lessons, in case you forget... Available on: <u>Play Store</u>.

ADVANCE NOTICE - YEAR 13 LEARNING PROGRAMME - ASSESSMENT WEEK 2

Monday 29th January 2024 to Friday 2nd February 2024 (inclusive)

From Monday 29th January to Friday 2nd February (inclusive), all students in Year 13 will be undertaking assessments in the subjects they are currently studying. For both A-level and BTEC subjects these assessments will be based on past paper questions, and indeed complete papers, and will be taken under exam conditions to best prepare your son/daughter for final examinations in May/June 2024.

Please find attached the exam timetable so your son/daughter is aware of when their examinations take place. All morning exams will start as soon as possible at 9:00am. It is vital that your son/daughter reports to the Arts Theatre at 8:50am to ensure we have a 9:00am start.

Afternoon examinations commence at 1:00pm. Your son/daughter should report to the Arts Theatre at 12:50pm.

Students for A-level subjects will have study leave during the exam period as follows: -

- 1. The morning before an afternoon exam i.e., Tuesday (am) for an exam scheduled Tuesday pm
- 2. The afternoon before a morning exam i.e., Monday (pm) for an exam scheduled for Tuesday am.

Students completing applied general qualifications and arts courses must attend lessons as normal when not in exams.

Please could you encourage and support your son/daughter to prepare thoroughly for these exams as they will give them a good indication of the progress they have made to date.



The Sixth Form will be providing revision guidance sessions during tutorial periods to ensure your son/daughter can prepare effectively for these important exams. In addition, there is an expectation that your son/daughter will attend their study+ sessions and use this time to effectively prepare.

Synergy is the primary source of communication from school to all parents in relation to your child.

Synergy also enables daily attendance alerts to be sent to parents and allows you to:

- report your child's absence from school
- query if your child has an unexplained absence mark
- inform the school if your child is going to be late
- let us know of any forthcoming medical appointments for your child
- reply to the Attendance Team if you have received an attendance alert

FREE SCHOOL MEAL FUNDING



IN PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE

Could your child qualify for Free School Meals? Has your income changed this year? Could your child be eligible for additional funding?

Do any of the statements below apply to you? If they do your child may be eligible to access additional government funding at school.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- · Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

It is important to give children the best possible chance in life, open as many doors as possible and broaden their horizons.

Additional funding may be available to school to support children who have faced challenges, overcome difficult times or are in a low income houshold.

Your child may be able to access additional funding if:

- They have been adopted from care
- They are on a special guardianship order
- They have a parent that regularly serves or died whilst serving in the armed forces

If any of the statements above apply to you please ensure you complete a FREE SCHOOL MEAL application from your local council. You will apply to the council that your home address is part of.
