

## **Foodbank Appeal for Teardrops**

One way they do this is through their foodbank in which people can donate selected food and drink items which help Teardrops to prepare Emergency Food Packs who cannot access a food bank vouchers and to prepare meals for those who access their facilities.

#### **ARTS ACADEMY NEWS**

It has been a busy few weeks for our Arts Academy students. First up was a visit to the theatre. Here is what Year 11 student Zoe Medwell thought of the performance:

"The 'real thrill of horror', as quoted by the Sunday Times, did not disappoint its audience. Rainhill High's Key Stage 4 and 5 Drama students embarked on a journey to the quaint Liverpool Playhouse to see Stephen Mallatratt's 'ingenious stage adaptation' of 'The Woman in Black' as inspiration for our Live Theatre Review. The first 20 minutes lured viewers into a sense of mundaneness but as the first act ensued, we were all enthralled by impeccable acting, lighting, haunting sound effects and the anticipation of the infamous ghost herself. The enchanting and suspenseful gothic tale only got better in the second act as they opened the set up further and explored the end of the harrowing story and by the final twist, I was already ready to see it again."

Our students were not the only ones impressed. We were delighted to receive the following from a member of theatre staff - "I was working at a performance of The Woman in Black at the Liverpool Playhouse. There was a party of students and staff from Rainhill High. A big thank you for their excellent behaviour and I hope they enjoyed the show".



This week our Sixth Form Arts Academy students took part in a zoom Q&A with practitioner Mark Wheeller who gave our students an insight into the process of creating their own verbatim play. Afterwards, Mark Wheeller commented; "What a great and interested group they were, well done".

Feedback from Sixth Former Alice Lee; "Our zoom meeting with Mark Wheeller was absolutely amazing, it felt surreal having learnt about him in the classroom and then there he was in our classroom! He was super helpful and personable; he even gave us ideas for our devising which was so insightful because he's so creative and just brilliant overall"



Our final event this term saw Year 12 and Year 13 Drama and Media students taking part in a workshop with actor and filmmaker Andrew Games.

# REPORTING ABSENCES/LATE TO SCHOOL/FORTHCOMING APPOINTMENTS/UNEXPLAINED ABSENCES VIA ABSENCE TAB ON SYNERGY

Synergy is the primary source of communication from school to all parents in relation to your child.

Synergy also enables daily attendance alerts to be sent to parents and allows you to:

- report your child's absence from school
- query if your child has an unexplained absence mark
- inform the school if your child is going to be late
- let us know of any forthcoming medical appointments for your child
- reply to the Attendance Team if you have received an attendance alert

<u>Please use Synergy to report absences in the first instance</u>. This can be actioned by accessing the contact school option from the home screen, followed by the absence option.

## FREE SCHOOL MEAL FUNDING



# IN PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE

# Could your child qualify for Free School Meals? Has your income changed this year? Could your child be eligible for additional funding?

Do any of the statements below apply to you? If they do your child may be eligible to access additional government funding at school.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- · Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

It is important to give children the best possible chance in life, open as many doors as possible and broaden their horizons.

Additional funding may be available to school to support children who have faced challenges, overcome difficult times or are in a low income houshold.

Your child may be able to access additional funding if:

- They have been adopted from care
- They are on a special guardianship order
- They have a parent that regularly serves or died whilst serving in the armed forces

If any of the statements above apply to you please ensure you complete a FREE SCHOOL MEAL application from your local council. You will apply to the council that your home address is part of.
